Working Together to Offer Dignity and Compassion to Our Local Community

The Shower Program and Unity clinic at Christ House provide essential resources to our neighors in need.

At Christ House, we believe that everyone deserves to have access to comprehensive and compassionate care. Early on in our existence, we began partnering with Unity Health Care to host an outpatient clinic on our first floor that provides medical and case management

services to individuals experiencing homelessness, in addition to our patients. As a part of this clinic, the Shower Program meets the more basic needs of our clientele.

What is the Shower Program?
The Shower Program offers
outpatient clients a set of

toiletries, a clean change of clothes, and the opportunity to take a hot shower while they are here for appointments at the Unity clinic. Christ House provides the showers, clothing, and toiletry items, while Unity provides a doctor, case manager, and staff person to oversee the clinic. We collect travel-sized toiletries and gently used clothing through our in-



The mission of Christ House is to provide comprehensive and compassionate health care to sick and homeless men from the District of Columbia, and to assist them in addressing the critical issues to help them break the cycle of homelessness.

kind giving program so that individuals have a prepared bag of items to use and take with them when they leave. The Shower Program and Unity clinic are open four afternoons a week and serve up to eight people a day.

Providing Compassionate Care

Henry Jones, the first member of the Kairos Program, has worked as the Shower Program Coordinator since April 1997. He manages the shower schedule, distributes clothing and toiletries, and greets all guests with empathy.

Henry says that guests often feel comfortable talking with him about their struggles and sees it as his ministry to provide a listening presence to them. He knows that a personal word of encouragement during their visit can be especially meaningful. Henry gratefully recalls how one of his fellow Kairos Program members first encountered Christ House through the

Shower Program. His gentle guidance led his friend to entrust Christ House with his medical care, which ultimately became a turning point in his life.

Henry's philosophy in managing the Shower Program is simple: "I become their friend. I don't bother them with judgmental questions because I remember how it feels to be in their situation."

A Powerful Partnership

For over 30 years, Unity Health Care and Christ House have worked together to serve the surrounding community through the Unity clinic and Shower Program. Dr. Janelle Goetcheus, one of the founders of Christ House, has remained deeply involved and works in the clinic every Thursday afternoon. The homeless patients she sees typically have little experience with health care and thus suffer from a wide range of health issues such as wounds, uncontrolled diabetes, high blood pressure, and mental illnesses. And still, after years

He asked the hospital staff to call Christ House and inquire about admission. We had an open spot and admitted Daniel, who was ultimately a patient for three months. "I take a shower every day simply because I know what it's like not to have that necessity available to you. When I go into the shower, I remember when I was homeless and couldn't get to one. And it's a good feeling...it's my quiet time when I'm showering." -Daniel, Kairos Program member
