# Day by Day

The Kairos Program is a permanent supportive housing program for former Christ House patients. Kairos House is a 37-unit building located two blocks away from Christ House.

Yards of fresh pine garland draped the Kairos House foyer for the recent Christmas season. The singing Santa figurine - a Kairos holiday staple - stood at the reception desk ready to serenade the next unsuspecting passerby. Some Kairos Members dressed their apartment doors with Christmas wrapping paper, and lights. Each hall decked for the same cause: to spread Christmas cheer.

A classic Christmas song professes the season to be "the most wonderful time of the year." Yet for some, Christmas is a time during which they are visited by grief, sadness, and loneliness. Vincent, a Kairos Member since December 2022, admits that Christmas is a difficult time for him. "I don't get a whole lot of joy out of Christmas...

I've just been by myself."

For Joel, a Kairos Member since April 2009, Christmas has become a time of reflection, "I think of [God] first and then I think of family and then I think of this wonderful community I'm in now." He reflects on how his life has changed since entering the Kairos Program. Christmas used to be about drugs and alcohol: "I was looking for the wrong

[Christmas] spirit. That was my problem." Today, Christmas is not about material goods, but rather the invaluable gifts he's been given - recovery, brotherhood, and spirituality through the Kairos Program.

Hervie has been a Kairos Member since March 2016. He describes Kairos Christmases as celebrations. "We praise the Lord and give out gifts for everyone. Just being together as one makes it

says this is his favorite part of

"I love the camaraderie of the whole day. It's like a family." Joel agrees: "[I like] getting up in the morning and saying 'Happy Holidays!' It's nice to see the new guys smile." Vincent will always miss his family during Christmas but acknowledges that this was the better of Christmases he's had in a while. "I haven't had a Christmas present in I don't know how long...Christmas at Kairos was peaceful, loving, and caring. Everybody has open arms."
