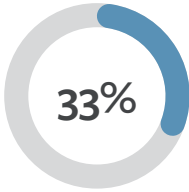

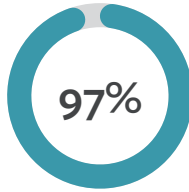

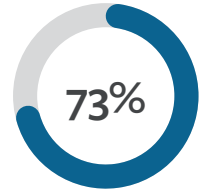
PATIENT DEMOGRAPHICS



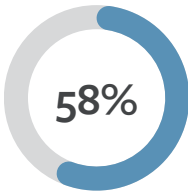
Patients with
diabetes



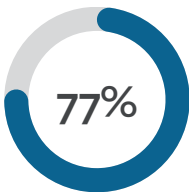
Patients with 3

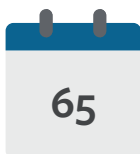
KAIROS PROGRAM

Christ House's Kairos Program is a residential recovery community, located around the corner from our medical respite facility, that provides permanent supportive housing in apartments for nearly 40 former patients.

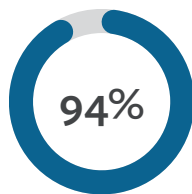

A PATIENT'S JOURNEY

Louis first experienced homelessness in the 1980s while holding a steady job. He and his wife were preparing to buy a home when she passed away after a battle with breast cancer, a loss that shifted the course of his life. After completing a residential treatment program for substance use disorder, Louis arrived at Christ House facing serious health challenges, including congestive heart failure, diabetes, and complications that required an amputation and leg bypass surgery.

With the support of our 24/7 team, his health significantly improved—his diabetes is now managed without daily injections, and he continues to build strength each day. A lover of music and food, Louis finds joy in listening to vinyl records and honing the cooking skills his wife once taught him. Today, Louis is a valued member of our Kairos Permanent Supportive Housing Program, where he continues his journey of healing.



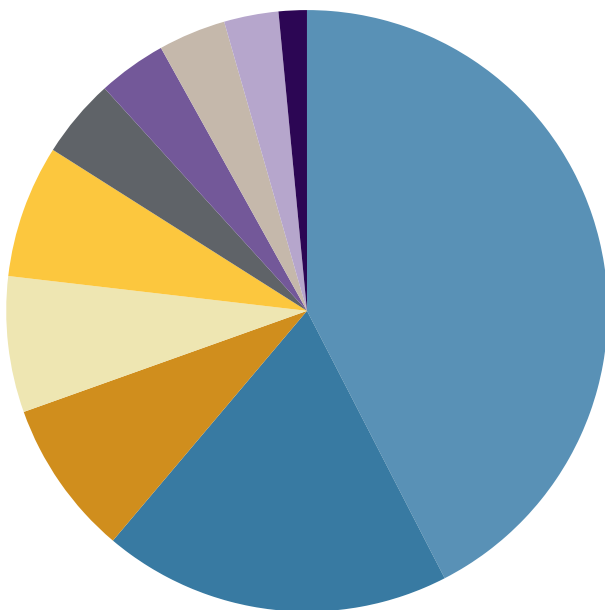












MEETING RISING NEEDS **WITH COMPASSION**

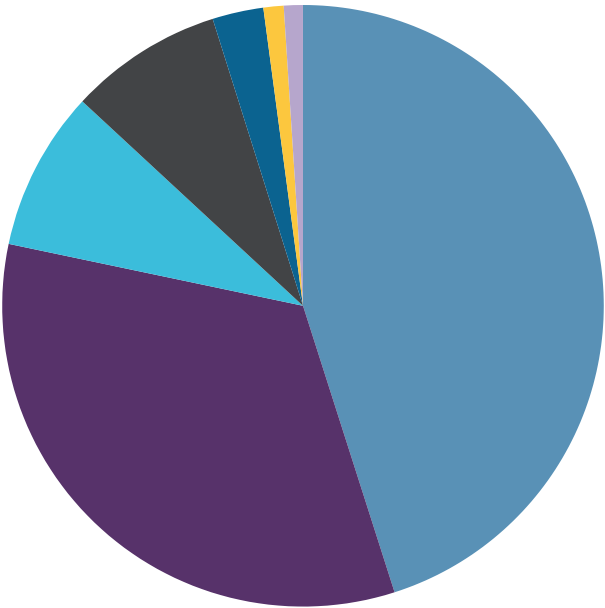
