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#### Year in Review: 2023

With your support, we were able to achieve impactful results in 2023 as we work toward providing comprehensive and compassionate care for men experiencing homelessness in Washington, DC. Each of our 208 patient admissions received personalized and 24/7 care during their 29-day average stay. Remarkably, 100% of our patients presented with three or more health needs and over 65% of our patients arrived directly from the hospital or from the streets, emphasizing the ongoing critical gap for comprehensive medical care for unhoused persons that Christ House fills. As we reflect on the previous year, we are inspired to continue providing a space for healing and hope as we enter our 39th year of operation.

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### **Building Trust: Martin's Story**

While the start of a new year is often known as a time for fresh starts and resolutions, for someone experiencing homelessness it also brings concerns of dropping temperatures. Earlier this month, a homeless outreach team became acquainted with Martin, who was vulnerable to the elements and dressed in wet clothes. The team discovered his blood pressure was critically high and he was experiencing distressing mental illness symptoms. Based on the team's recommendation, Martin was admitted to Christ House for further evaluation and treatment.

By chance, the team's lead physician had been a Year Long Volunteer at Christ House in the 1990's. She accompanied Martin to our facility where he was given clean, dry clothing upon his arrival. Though he now had a warm place to sleep, his feet were macerated from being outdoors, and his body showed evidence of frostbite. Our clinical team learned that he had been hospitalized several times from ailments he received while living on the street, and he expressed distrust of medical professionals. Despite this challenge, Martin began taking blood pressure medication to help stabilize his condition. Daily blood pressure checks allowed our providers to make adjustments to Martin's medication and obtain optimal blood pressure control. From there, he was connected to a psychiatrist who confirmed his mental health conditions and assisted him in obtaining the proper medication. In the three short weeks since Martin's admission to Christ House, his mental and physical health have improved with the care that he has received.

More recently, Martin indicated that he is having difficulty with his vision, and is now scheduled to meet with a provider for an eye exam. He also welcomed treatment for a previous hand injury after bringing it to our awareness. With every small act of care, our staff has built trust with Martin to voice his concerns and advocate for his health. The changes in Martin's well-being are a reflection of the warmth offered by the Christ House community. Thank you for your support this winter and for helping us keep more patients out of the cold.
